Houston's First Ever Dussehra Mela at Skeeter's Constellation Field on Nov. 4

HOUSTON: Shri Sita Ram Foundation, USA announces the first ever Dussehra Mela to be held on Sunday, November 4 from 3 to 9pm. This event has been supported by India Culture Center of Houston, India House, Hindus of Greater Houston, Houston Gujarat Samaj, Hindu Worship Society, Banke Bihari Parivar, Meenakshi Temple, Indian Senior Citizen's Association, Shri Swaminarayan Temple, Ashtalaxmi Temple, and Govindji Gudia Maatha.

The program will include children's costume contest, bhajans, Ram Leela stage show, dances by premier dance schools of Houston area, maha aarti, burning of effigies of Ravan, Meghnath and Kumbhkarn (first of its kind in Houston) which have been imported from India for this specific purpose. This will be followed by fireworks and Dandia Rass.

The food stalls will have a number of delicious mouth watering food items from well known vendors like Mirch Masala, Natura, WJ farms, Baloch Ice Cream, Durrani's, Sankalp, Pavani, and Bombay Sweets.

The non food Bazaar will have nearly 30 booths for ladies suits, bangles, bindis, cosmetics, balloons, mehndi, various Diwali & Dussehra items, face painting etc.

The entire show will be on a stage in the field and will also be displayed on a 200' x 90' digital screen and all the TV monitors at the Constellation Field Stadium which can be watched from the stands with comfortable seats.

Parking is free. Valet parking is provided free for all Mercedes owners by one of the sponsors, Mercedes Benz of Sugarland.
