The original three effigies that were custom designed in New Delhi, India could not be used as they towered over 10 feet tall and thus were not permissible. As a result, a set of three more effigies were made (10" tall) to burn at the finale. A grand arati by the 8000 strong audience, who held out their lighted lamps, was a spectacular sight that added a personal touch to the event.

Apart from a host of community leaders, Congressman Pete Olson was a welcomed guest. He presented Dr. Verma with a proclamation and spoke on the occasion. A proclamation from Congressman Al Green was also presented on his behalf by Sam Merchant. Shri Sita Ram Foundation, USA is a non-profit organization which produced and has introduced the two mega events 'Ram Leela' and now Dusshera Mela to the Indo-American community in Houston. The
